



The matter of vacation of road petition for by H. S. Parks and others was taken up and after due consideration of all matters pertaining to said petition and remonstrance thereon motion was allowed and that part of road referred to in said petition is vacated.
The petition of Wm. A. Glaze and others for the establishment of a certain road was taken up and by reason of a petition withdrawing ten names from said Glaze's petition making said petition not a legal petition. The said petition was laid over until the next meeting.
Petition of Frank Nutto and others to vacate a portion of road No. 1 and change same to different route was taken up and on motion the clerk was instructed to appoint a commissioner to view said portion of road for vacation and location of said portion of road No. 1.


