Much that is in this consular report ms been said before, but it will bear requent reiteration because of the augular tendency of Americans to reand Mexico as a promising land for the ploneer. The type of ploneer who opened up the western country for scitlement is likely to full in Mexico for the reason that the country is al-The consular report warns Aurel or western country. There is room buly for men with capital or technical knowledge or both. If one is not postessed of expert technical knowledge or ability in the industries that flourish in Mexico one must be able to se mre the services of men who are thus squipped. Capital will not extract vealth from the national resources of Mexico unless it can command the services of the trained mining enrincer, the Pained architect, the imined veterim vian, the skilled agriculturist. In addition to technical ikill, or the ability to employ it, the eport urges a speaking knowledge of the Spanish language, without which he chances of success, it declares, are




