


SHAA ECONOMY.

Some of the boys left Lincoln on a journey to Chickamauga, and to Manila, without as much as a fifty-cent piece in their pockets. The matter was presented personally to Governor Holcomb before the departure of the boys by their friends and their parents, but the pay was not forthcoming. Many of the men were not paid for five months after the state turned the troops over to the government.


