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FIRE LIMITS FOR THE VILLAGE OF LOUP CITY, NEBRASKA.

An Ordinance regulating and placing fire limits within the Village of Loup City, Nebraska, and regulations governing the same.

Be it ordained by the Chairman and Board and Trustees of the Village of Loup City:

SEC. 1.—FOUNDAIRES. That all that part of the Village of Loup City contained in the following limits shall be hereafter known as the fire limits of the Village of Loup City, Nebraska, to-wit:

SEC. 2.—TRAILWAYS. No building shall be hereafter erected in said fire limits, unless all outside walls shall be built of stone, brick or other fireproof material.

SEC. 3.—SAME. Roofs, cornices and gutters, shall be covered on the outside surface with copper, tin, zinc or other fireproof material.

SEC. 4.—SAME. No wooden building or part of building within said fire limits shall be raised, repaired, enlarged or removed to any other place within said limits.

SEC. 5.—SAME. The amount or extent of the damages that may be done to any building may be determined by three disinterested persons, residents of the Village.

SEC. 6.—PENALTY. Any person who shall own, build or aid in the erection of any building, contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, shall be liable to a fine of five dollars.

SEC. 7.—NUISANCE. Any wooden building which may be erected, enlarged, removed or repaired, contrary to this ordinance, shall be deemed a nuisance and upon information in writing to the chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Board shall cause the same to be removed.
