It is not generally known among our citizens that if an injury occurs from a defective sidewalk that the injured person's first recourse is upon the property owner whose side-walk caused the accident and upon the city or village corporation if such property owner is not financially capable of liquidating the damage. There are many dangerous places in our city and several accidents have already happened. There has been more or less criticism of the board of trustees for not forcing property owners to repair their walks. It is an easy matter to criticize and find fault, but it must be born in mind that to compel this generally entails considerable expense on the village, as the repairing must be paid for out of the street fund and then levied against the property and collected as a special tax, and the outcome generally is a law suit, and if a technicality can be secured up they are very liable to defeat the collection of the tax and the city foots the bill and the individual laughs in his sleeve. So a conservative board is not much inclined to take these risks. But if some one is compelled to face a large sized damage suit one of these days it may cause others to ask where they are at.
