SHERMAN COUNTY SOON TO BE REDEEMED.

GIBSON ELECTED CLERK AND THE COURT HOUSE RING IS BUSTED

And now the Republicans of Sherman county can truly say "glory enough for one day." We have made very substantial gains all along down the ticket, and have elected the clerk by a safe majority. The county vote is counted for the fusionist state ticket by a majority of only 119 as against 350 four years ago and in 1896 for Bryan of over 400. We only lacked five votes of electing two out of three supervisors which plainly shows which way the tide is turning and what we might expect to do after another year of Republican prosperity.
