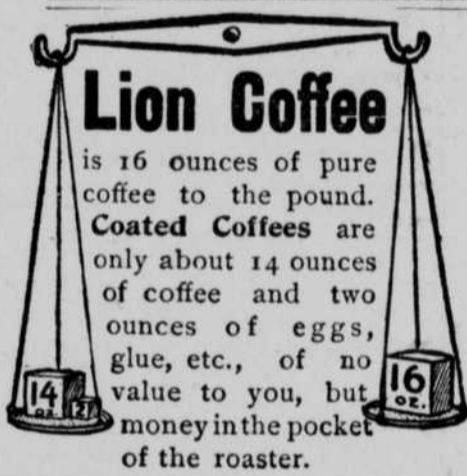

DIED.
Hans Henry Plumbback, an old and respected citizen of this county died at his home on Oak Creek last Saturday morning Jan. 18, 1902. Age 51 years.
Mr Plumbback came from Germany to this country in 1870 and first settled at Grand Island He moved to Sherman County in 1876 and took a home-stead on Oak Creek, where he has ever since resided. For several years past he has been in ill health, being troubled by occasional attacks of Apoplexy, which became worse from time to time and so destroyed his physical being. Mr. Plumbback was a good friend and neighbor and his many friends will be sorry to learn of his death.
The funeral services were held at Loup City, Jan. 21, a short service was held at the house at 10 o'clock A. M. and in the city at 1 P. M. The remains were taken to the Evergreen Cemetery for interment. There was a large turnout at the funeral as many friends came to pay their last respects to the departed. He leaves a wife and three children to mourn his loss.
