Loup City Neb. Jan. 10, 1902, 9 o'clock A. M. Pursuant to adjournment of Jan. 6th, 1902. The County Board of Supervisors met at the Court House, in Loup City, Neb., in said County, Present—All members of County Board.

On motion the following resolution was adopted. And now this 10th day of January 1902 the application of Gilbert Wands for admission to the Nebraska Soldiers and Sailors Home coming up for consideration and it appearing to the board, that he was a Private of Co. C, 65th Regt. Ill. Vol. Inf. and a pensioner under certificate No. 631,308, and of the age of 73 yrs. and by reason of his age is unable to earn a livelihood, and has been a resident of Sherman County for over two years last past.

Financial Statement of FRANK BADURA, Treasurer of Sherman County, Nebraska, from July 1st, 1901, to January 8th, 1902:

Board adjourned to 1 o'clock P. M. Board met pursuant to adjournment; all members present. Board then took up the matter of consent roads, and the petition of Wm. Knutzen et al for a consent road commencing at Howell avenue at the south line of Carlton street in the Village of Ashton and intersecting with county road No. 68, at a point 4 rods east of the northwest corner of section 27 Town 15 Range 13 be established, and the land owners having land adjoining said road signed said petition and waived all claims for any damages for said road.

The matter of the petition of John Hetzel et al for a consent road commencing at the Northwest corner of section 31, Township 13, Range 13, terminating at the road running southwest and intersecting the road to Ravenna, Neb. was considered and allowed and clerk ordered to record and plat the same. John Hetzel agreeing in writing on said petition to stand, without compensation, all of the road beginning at south west corner of Section 31, Township 13, Range 13.
