The following proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set fourth in fall, is submitted to the electors State of Nebraska, to be The Ord Quiz says in one editorial voted upon at the general election he held Tuesday, November 4 to D. 1902. A

> Joint resolution proposing to amend section one of Article flifteen, of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska. relative to the manner of submit ting and adopting amendments to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska

Be it Resolved and Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. That section one of Article fifteen of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended to read as fol lows:

Section 1. Either branch of the leg islature may propose amendments to this Constitution, and if the same be agreed to by three-fifths of the members elected to each house, such proposed amendments shall be entered on the Journals, with the yeas and nays, and published at least once each week in at least one newspaper in each county where a newspaper is published, for thirty days immediately preceding the next election of senators and representatives, at which election the same shall be submitted to the such election on such proposed amend. amendment is submitted at the same




