The fact is, the advertisement published the next day, properly, made it plain that the advertiser had a villa in Whitestone which he regarded as choice, and he so described it.

An advertisement appeared in a newspaper last summer which came out a second time, but in quite a new form. Whether the original shape was the result of the hasty work of the advertiser or the typo is a question. This is the way it came out first:


