Republican County Convention

Loup City, Neb., March 8, 1904—The Republican electors of Sherman county, Nebraska, are hereby requested to send delegates from their respective townships to meet in convention at Loup City, Nebraska, on Tuesday, April 26th, 1904, at 11 o'clock a. m. for the purpose of electing delegates to the Republican State and Senatorial conventions for the year 1904, to elect a county central committee and the chairman thereof, and to place in nomination a candidate for county attorney and a candidate for Representative of the 57th district of Nebraska. Also to transact such other business as may properly come before said convention.

The several townships are entitled to representation as follows: the apportionment being based upon the vote cast at the last general election for the Hon. John B. Barnes, Judge of the Supreme Court, giving each township one delegate for every seven votes or major fraction thereof and one delegate at large:
