

On the 1st of July the Indians will have near Sonora a big fish killing. which is considered great sport by them. Already a supply of "devil's shoestring" is being gathered for this purpose. This is the root of a certain bush, and owing to the fact that these roots go so deep, in so many directions, it is considered quite a task to get sufficient for use at a fish shoot. On this particular occasion it is said that 2,500 bundles of "devil's shoestring" will be used. The Indians select a portion or hole of water in the river, and some of them will beat up this root and throw it in the water. 


