



Someone has said that one good thick egg shell contains more lime than a bushel of grain. It is true that the fowls get lime from some of their other foods to a small extent and possibly some of the gravel they eat contains lime, but the modern hen must have lime supplied her if she

is expected to lay eggs with shelis cf fair thickness. It is surprising how much lime some hens will eat. I found an old abandoned cellar awhile ago, and from it







raised for market is a question that must be settled by every man who is trying to make money out of ducks. It is supposed that ducks are ready for market at about ten weeks of age, and it is certain that if they are sold at that time they will yield a greater profit than if kept for some months lorger. During the mowing period ducks are making gain rapidly and are doing it at little cost. After the eighth c ninth week the gain is made less slowly, but the cost of feeding continues and even increases. Every week the birds are fed after that, decreases the possibility of profits. Some poultry raisers say, "Sell the ducks as soon as they are well feathered."

Amateur Poultry-Raisers.

One of the most inviting lines of business in the world is poultry-raising. There is no business that promises so great profits as this, at least in the world of agriculture. But on every hand we see the remains of poultry yards that have been started by people that knew nothing about the business and have made a lamentable failure.
