The Anti-Cigarette Law.

Below is the new anti-cigarette lay passed by the recent legislature an which goes into effect July 1:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawfu Gilbert, Prop. on and after the date this act shall go into effect to manufacture, sell, give away or willingly allow to be taken any eigarettes or the material for their composition, known as the cigarett

Section 2. That any person, firm association or corporation in this stat violating the provisions of this act, h or they shall be guilty of a misdemeano and shall upon conviction thereof be fined for each and every offense a sun not less than \$50, nor more than \$100 at the discretion of the court, togethe with costs of prosecution.

Section 3. Any officer, director or manager having in charge or contro separately or jointly with others th business of any corporation, which corporation violates the provisions of this act if he have knowledge of the same, shall be guilty and subject to the penalty herein provided.


