

"The amount of money so voted as being necessary for the maintainance of the school for the coming year shall be certified by the district school board to the county clerk of the county in which said school district is located, and said amount shall be levied by the County Board on the assessed value of the school district and be collected as other

The assessed valuation of School District No. 1 is more than \$158,000 and a levy of 19 mills would have raised more than \$3,000, the amount asked by the school board, The amount levied, to-wit: 25 mills, is to raise \$3959. Who authorized this amount of levy? The school district authorized a levy to raise \$3,000 only.
