### "Was Did?"

On Wednesday morning of this week, we were handed a copy of the following resolutions which Mr. Fisher informed us were passed by the camp:

"Be it Resolved by the members of Loup City Camp No. 528 in a regular session on this 2nd day of Oct. 1906:

"That we do hereby condemn the article published in the Loup City Northwestern of its issue of Sept. 27th entitled 'Failure but whose fault was it.' That the same was unwarranted, malicious and untrue and was only prompted by the petty jealousy of its editor, and 'was did' for the purpose of creating contention and strife among our members; therefore was an insult to our camp.

"Be it further Resolved that these resolutions be spread upon the Records of our camp and a copy offered for publication to each of the newspapers of Loup City."

By reference to the Northwestern of last week, it will be seen that we did not say one word derogatory of the order, of which we are a member, and have been for some seven years, but only spoke of the failure of those who attempted to get up a Woodman Day, led by its clerk, who ignored the larger part of its membership. While calling it a failure, as it was, and which all will acknowledge, we deprecated the action of the clerk, but said not one word in derogation of the Modern Woodmen of America which we said was "one of the greatest as well as one of the best fraternal organizations ever in existence. There fore, the above resolutions, engineered by Gibson and passed by perhaps a dozen or fifteen who were present, out of a total membership in this camp of 120 in the neighborhood of 200, as we understand, will only react upon the originator and plainly show the animus of the little fellow.

And so ex-County Clerk Gibson admits he was short in his accounts at the close of his first term. Nuf sed, "Not that I love McKinnie more; but that I love Brown less." Gibson's attitude on the representative candidates.

Who is it that has been filling the air with his nauseating and venomous bad English, bad grammar and bad orthography, till his ignorance and bad taste has caused him to be something to be despised and avoided by a large class of our best people? We have no desire to soil our hands in a jangle of this kind, but when an infection is in our midst, some one must handle the disinfectant.

### PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as heretofore adopted, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 6, A. D. 1906.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. That at a general election for State and Legislative officers to be held on Tuesday, succeeding the first Monday in November, 1906, the following provision be and the same shall be a part of the constitution of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 6, A. D. 1906.

Section 2. There shall be a State Railway Commission, consisting of three members, who shall be first elected at the general election in 1906, whose term of office, except those chosen at the first election under this provision, shall be six years, and whose compensation shall be fixed by the Legislature.

Of the three commissioners first elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes, shall hold his office for six years, the next highest for four years, and the lowest two years. The powers and duties of such commission shall include the regulation of rates, service and general control of common carriers as the legislature may provide by law. But in the absence of specific legislation, the commission shall exercise the powers and perform the duties enumerated in this provision.

Section 3. That at said election in the year 1906, on the ballot of each elector voting thereat, there shall be printed or written the words: "For Constitution Amendment, with reference to State Railway Commission," and "Against State Railway Commission." With Reference to Constitutional Amendment, With Reference to State Railway Commission. And if a majority of all votes cast at said election shall be for such amendment, the same shall be deemed to be adopted.

I, A. Galusha, secretary of state of the state of Nebraska, do hereby certify that the foregoing proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska is a true and correct copy of the original enrolled and engrossed bill as passed by the Twenty-sixth session of the legislature of the State of Nebraska, as appears from said original bill on file in this office, and that said proposed amendment is submitted to the qualified voters of the state of Nebraska for their adoption or rejection at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 6th day of November, A. D. 1906.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and added the great seal of the state of Nebraska.

Done at Lincoln this 34th day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Six, of the Independence of the United States the One Hundred and Thirty-second, and of this state the Forty-third.
