

Fill the jar twothirds full of cold water and set away over night. In the morning a smooth, transparent jelly will be the result, and this should be well stirred up from the bottom with a stick. Let it stand for three nights in this way, stirring it up each morning. Then add a few drops of wintergreen to scent it nicely, and it is ready for use. Turn into a small jelly tumbler for immediate use, keeping the large jar air-tight. This 'paste is not at all sticky and can be applied with the fingers, if necessary, without disagreeable results.

Lemon Souffle.

One pint boiling water, two tablespoonfuls cornstarch, mixed in a little cold water; boil until as thick as a custard; add a little salt, also butter size of a nut; take from stove, add volks of three eggs beaten with a cup of sugar, juice and rind of one large lemon; mix well; bake 15 minutes; take from oven, put on white of eggs; beat with three teaspoonfuls powdered sugar. Brown and serve cold.
