

A new post office regulation law which is now in effect makes it no longer necessary to buy a special de-livery stamp to secure immediate de-livery of a letter. Ten cents in stamps of any denomination, in addition to of any denomination, in addition to the ordinary postage. is all that is required for transmission of letters and packages for special delivery. When the usual special delivery stamp is not used the words "for special delivery" should be written prominently on the letter or package. If not so designated the letter or package may be sent by the clerk as registered mail which is not specially delivered.


