





They and sprinkle with a few drops of alcohol. Over this place a tin funnel with the point upward. Touch a lighted match to the alcohol: wet the stained linen, and hold the spot over the opening in the point of the funnel The sulphur fumes will remove the most obstinate stain, seldom requiring more than one application. Rinse and wash the linen at once, to prevent rotting the material .- Woman's Home Companion for September.
