

The supreme court recently heard argument on motion of R. Mead Shumway for a rehearing. Shumway was convicted for murdering Mrs. Martin of Gage county and the supreme court affirmed the death sentence and set October 30 last as the date of execution of the judgment. The court later set the date of execution for January 8, pending argument on a motion for a new trial. The new date of the death sentence is one day after Governor elect Shallenberger takes his seat as governor. If the court refuses to grant a rehearing the condemned man will have an opportunity to appeal to two governors for a pardon or commutation of sentence. James Barton, a young colored man,
