Why, Burleigh, the roads over here—all over Europe—are a delight to the eye, and more so to the travel-er who is compelled to use them. We left Frankfort at 12:46 and arrived here at Munich at 9 o'clock last evening, the last two-thirds of the journey being through a beautiful agricultural country in which the noticeable features was that there was a village located about every two miles with its church the largest building in the village, and not a house or fence between. The fields were arranged so that generally there was from one half to one acre in one crop. Not one farmer's horse and buggy did I see in the entire distance. In only one instance on the entire journey did I see a team of horses hitched to a farm implement, in another a horse and an oxidate. Only set of Abstract books in county about three other places a lone horse, but there were numbers of women and a few men with hoes cultivating, and sickles cutting the timothy and clover. The whole country is a garden, and it is so by reason of the small holdings of those who care for the land. When politicians talk about cheap farm implements in Europe "it is a dream." 
