We are indebted to County Clerk Dieterichs for the following figures on mortgages in this county: During the year 1910 there were filed 280 farm mortgages, amounting to \$617,036.07, while the same number, 280, were released, though the sum total of dollars in the releases amounted to only about half filed, or \$306,598.99. 
