## DRAINAGE PROJECT

Pleasanton Man Undertaking a \$4,000 Ditching Proposition

Robert Keitchman, who owns a farm four miles north of Pleasanton, is about to undertake a \$4,000 ditching proposition to reclaim nearly a quarter section of what is now swamp land. This land has a rich deep soil but it is so located that it floods to such an extent as to make it useless for agricultural purposes.

This land is to be drained by a ditch about a mile in length, and the work will involve cutting a tunnel through a hill. The work will cost in the neighborhood of \$4,000 but it will make of practically worthless land a farm double the cost of the ditch.

It is said that there is quite a large acreage of land in this county, along the Platte and Loup rivers susceptible to this kind of treatment, and the result of Mr. Keitchman's undertaking will be watched with interest.
