Marshal Hayes left for Omaha Monday morning, and as the young man had escaped once or twice before the marshal took no chances with him, but gave him a pair of bracelets to wear, and after entering the car clapped on the leg irons. The relatives of Mitchell here and in South Dakota are eminently respectable people, and the guilt of the young man will deeply hurt and mortify them, and our people will deeply regret the unfortunate affair for there


