## MAINTENANCE OF GOOD ROADS

People in Many States Are Filled With Enthusiasm for Improvement of Public Highways.

The present year promises to be the greatest in the history of the movement for the improvement of the public roads of the United States, accord ing to the reports received from all parts of the country by the United States department of agriculture. A joint committee of congress is engaged in an investigation of the feasibility of federal aid in the construc tion, improvement and maintenance of public highways, and a number of the state legislatures are considering good road legislation. In connection with the general impetus that the good road movement has recently had in all parts of the country, the director of the office of public highways says:

"Too much stress cannot be laid upon the importance of maintenance in connection with the work of improving the roads. The people in nearly all the states are filled with enthusiasm for road improvement and are spending enormous sums of money in the construction of superb roads, and yet almost without exception they are making little provision to care for the roads after they are built. This is true not only in the various counties, but under many of our state highway departments.

"To maintain the roads in good conlition year after year requires a considerable annual outlay, but this outlay is infinitely less than the loss which must fall upon the people eventually if they allow their roads to go to utter ruin. The thing for all advo. continuous, systematic maintenance, and the setting aside every year of an amount per mile estimated by the engineer in charge to be sufficient for the proper maintenance of the road-a course which must make for economy and efficiency."


