

## Glacier National Park Newly Revealed Wonderland

This region of majestic, glacier-capped mountains—the climax of the rugged grandeur of the Rockies—is reached by the Great Northern Railway from Glacier Park Station, at which point the Railway Company has constructed a hundred thousand dollar hotel. An automobile road has been built from this station to the interior of the Park.
