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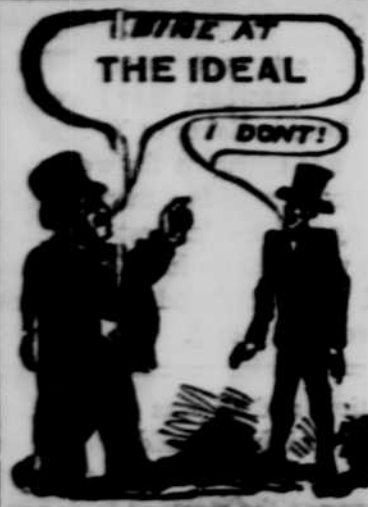

County Board of Supervisors met this day pursuant to adjournment of November 19, 1913 with all members present...

McIlwain as precinct assessor of Webster Township made by County Assessor W. T. Owens, Tax protest of W. R. Jenkins laid over till next meeting, Board on motion allowed tax protest of Mrs. Louisa Stine, she not being liable for poll tax and treasurer ordered to refund her the sum of \$2.50 the amount paid under protest, Tax protest of D. W. Titus on motion disallowed, Tax protests of Walter Woznick, G. P. George and W. W. E. Grossmicklaus were on motion allowed and Treasurer ordered to refund to each of them the sum of \$2.50 the amount paid under protest for the reason that they had been assessed with poll tax twice, Board on motion adjourned till 9 a. m. tomorrow.

January 9th, 1914.

Smith County Judge also depository bonds of First National Bank of Loup City and First National Bank of Litchfield were on motion approved.

Bonds of L. B. Polski County Clerk and A. W. Boecking Deputy County Clerk were on motion approved.

Bridge committee reported that they had inspected new steel bridges numbers 6, 8 and 13 and found them built according to plans and specifications, recommended same settled for as per contract price. Board on motion accepted said report.

Bids for county supplies and printing were opened. The Board on motion awarded J. W. Burleigh contract for the furnishing of letter heads, envelopes and publishing Supervisors proceedings, C. F. Beushausen the contract for publishing Treasurer's statements, Delinquent Tax list and all other legal publications, Klapp Printing Co. of Omaha, Nebr. the contract for furnishing the blank books, records, assessors and election supplies, and tax receipts. Bid of Klapp Printing Co. for the furnishing of stationery was rejected. Bond of Klapp Printing Co. approved.

Board adjourned for dinner.

Request of E. A. Smith County Judge for clerk hire with salary not to exceed \$500, for the year 1914 was on motion granted.
