**Supervisors Proceedings.**

Loup City, Neb., Jan. 13, 1914. County board of supervisors met in regular session at the court house this day at one o'clock p. m.

Present, Supervisors Jensen, Brown, Rewolinski and Lang.

Thomas Jensen was appointed temporary chairman.

The temporary chairman appointed Brown, Lang and Rewolinski as committee on credentials to examine the credentials of supervisors holding over.

Said committee reported that they had examined the credentials of H. H. Aden, J. H. Welty and Dan McDonald and also their bonds which have been approved by the county judge as provided by law, and on motion said holders of supervisors were declared seated.

J. H. Welty was then on motion chosen chairman for the year 1914.

Minutes of last meeting read and on motion approved as read.

Board on motion adjourned till 9 a. m. tomorrow.

Jan. 14, 14.

Board met pursuant to adjournment of yesterday, with all members present.

Protest of R. W. Frost was on motion allowed, he being assessed with a mortgage being the tax claim, not therefore being liable for the tax thereon.

On motion, duly made, seconded and carried, was allowed W. B. Eastham \$30.27 as damages by reason of the establishment of Kohl's road in full settlement of the differences of his claim filed and the amount heretofore allowed by the board.

Action of the board relative to the awarding of contracts for county supplies was on motion reconsidered.

Bids for the furnishing of county supplies were again taken up and on motion duly seconded and carried the board awarded contracts the same as in their meeting of the 9th instant, with the exception of election supplies, which was left on the open market.

Bonds of J. W. Burleigh, C. F. Boush and Klapp, county clerks of Omaha, Nebr., were on motion approved.

The following estimate of expenses of the county for the next fiscal year was on motion made as follows:

Board adjourned for dinner.

Board met after dinner with all members present.

The chairman appointed the following standing committees for the coming year:

On Bridge—Brown, Rewolinski and Lang.

On Road—Aden, McDonald and Jensen.

On Claims—McDonald, Brown and Lang.

On Finance—Rewolinski, Aden and Jensen.

The matter of the establishment of the Johnson road now came up for consideration. The line of said road is commencing at Road No. 65 on the line between Elm and Webster townships, running thence north on township line between Elm and Webster townships 36 and 25-16-16 and sections 30 and 31-16-16 and terminating at Road No. 142, said road to be 40 feet wide. It appearing to the board that all parties have consented to the establishment of said road and waived damages, except Christ, Zwick and Wilhelm Aufrecht, and they having consented to the establishment thereof upon the payment of \$50 damages to Christ, Zwick and \$122 damages to Wilhelm Aufrecht, which amounts were allowed them, the board ordered said road established, platted and recorded.

The clerk was on motion instructed to buy two new Protectographs for his and the county treasurer's office.

The bonds of Chas. Quartz and Ernest Dabow on motion approved.

The chairman was on motion instructed and empowered to approve bonds in absence of the board.

On motion made, seconded and duly carried, the board passed resolution transferring \$808.13 from the poor fund to the general fund.

On motion made, seconded and duly carried, the board passed resolution transferring \$1,528.13 from the general fund to the bridge fund.

The claims committee reported that they had allowed all claims. Report was on motion approved and clerk was instructed to draw warrants on the respective funds.
