## Gas Discovered in Nebraska

Workmen engaged in drilling for water on the farm of Commodore O. Grady, three miles northeast of Dawson, Neb., has struck gas in ninety feet of sand.

The roar of escaping gas was heard for a half a mile above the sound of the drilling machinery. Some water was struck. The gas causes it to bubble and roar and steam while throwing it out. This confirms the idea that there is oil and gas, as well as other mineral deposits in southeastern Nebraska.

The location of this hole is on a ridge somewhat higher than the surrounding ground, between the Muddy and Nemaha rivers. It is a district where there has been more or less trouble getting water, although many springs crop out on equally high ground within a mile of this gas well. The state geologist is expected here to look over this proposition, as it is the first of its kind in the state of Nebraska.
