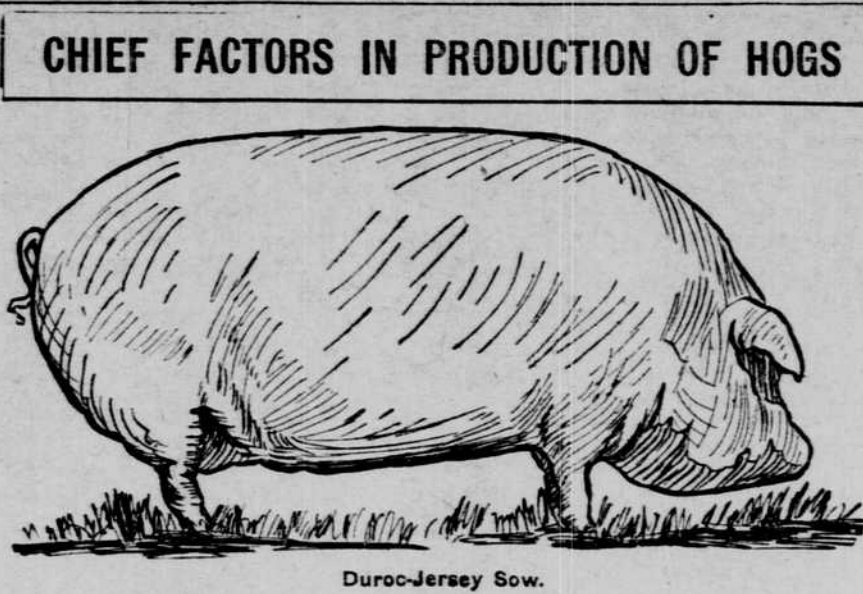

There are three general classes of feeding, as follows: Dry-lot feeding, feeding on dairy by-products and feeding on forage crops. By dry lot feeding is meant feeding in confined pens; pasture means native pasture, as blue grass, etc.; forage crops include alfalfa and the crops which require to be planted each year, and dairy by-products are skim milk, whey and buttermilk.
