Fire in the Erazim Home

A very mysterious fire developed in the basement of the Anton Erazim home in this city, Monday evening, shortly after six o'clock. A fire alarm was sent in but the fire was extinguished by members of the family before serious damage had been done and before the hose company could reach the place. The fire developed in a barrel containing a half dozen pieces of cured meat—bacon and ham. There had been no fire of any kind in the barrel, the meat was simply stored therein, and a loose cover covered the top, which would seem to preclude the possibility of a fire gaining any headway to it but for all that the barrel was pretty well consumed by the fire before it was extinguished. The only theory on which the fire can be accounted for is spontaneous combustion, but those who have had the most experience in handling cured meats declare they never heard of spontaneous combustion developing under such conditions. —Ravenna News.
