



> rency to discontinue permitting overdrafts, and for the following reasons, after April 1st next, we will discontinue the practice of cashing any and all checks where the maker or account has not sufficient funds to his credit to pay the same.

First: It has been found that patrons who favor conservative banking disapprove the overdraft. Second: The overdraft is one of the worst abuses of country banking. It consists, as a rule, of the customer making a loan to himself without the knowledge or consent of the bank's officers, without note or security.
