

# ITALY'S FORMAL

FULL TEXT OF THE DECLARA-TION MADE BY THE GOVERN-MENT AT ROME.

### GERMANY MAKES QUICK REPLY

Asserts Firm Determination to Stand by Its Ally-Now Eleven Nations Are Involved in Gigantic Conflict That Is Rending Europe.

Vienna.-The Italian ambassador to Austria, the Duke of Avarna, presented to Baron von Burian, the Austro-Hungarian foreign minister, the following declaration of war:

"Vienna, May 23, 1915.-Conformably with the orders of his majesty, the king, his august sovereign, the undersigned ambassador of Italy has the honor to deliver to his excellency the foreign minister of Austria-Hungary the following communication:

"Declaration has been made, as from the 4th of this month, to the imperial and royal government of the grave motives for which Italy, confident in her good right, proclaimed annulled and henceforth without effect her treaty of alliance with Austria-Hungary, which was violated by the imperial and royal government, and resumed her liberty of action in this respect.

"The government of the king, firmly resolved to provide by all means at by Piedmont and France, and even its disposal for safeguarding Italian after Piedmont had taken over Lomrights and interests, cannot fail in its duty to take against every existing and future menace measures which events impose upon it for the fulfillment of national aspirations.

"His majesty, the king, declares that he considers himself from tomorrow in a state of war with Austria-The undersigned has the honor to

make known at the same time to his excellency the foreign minister, that passports will be placed this very day at the disposal of the imperial and royal ambassador at Rome, and he will be obliged to his excellency if he will kindly have his passports handed

"(Signed). AVARNA."

### OFFICIAL GERMAN REPLY.

London.-A Berlin official dispatch, received by way of Amsterdam and dated May 23, says:

"The Italian government today caused to be declared through the ambassador to the Austrian-Hungarian government, the Duke of Avarna, that ter dey've had ter neglect us deserv- Italy considers herself in a state of war with Austria-Hungary.

"The Italian government, by this inexcusable attack against the dual monarchy, has also broken, without right or without ground, her alliance with Germany.

"The loyal relationship existing conformably with the treaty between Austria-Hungary and the German empire, and still more firmly welded by the comradeship of arms, has remained unimpaired by the defection of the third ally and his desertion to the enemy's camp. The German ambassador, therefore, has received instructions to leave Rome conjointly with the Austro-Hungarian ambassa-

#### **CAREFULLY ADJUST POULTRY FANCIERS' NEED OF INDUSTRY COLLAR OF HORSES**

Sore Shoulders Are More Easily Prevented Than Cured—Rest the Team Often.

I have found that sore shoulders on horses at plowing and cultivation time are due largely to a lack of humane thought and to neglect on the progress made in growing market the part of the driver. We cannot be too careful about fitting the collars. The trouble lies there. The collar should be fitted to every horse with precision and pains. It is cruel and a mistake to change harness from one team to another without carefully adjusting the collar each time, says a writer in Baltimore American. The padding of the collar should be attention. To thoroughly know a worked down with the hands until it conforms to the shape of the horse's shoulder. The surface of the collar

should be clean and free from grit. When the collars are removed after working it takes but little time to bathe the shoulders in cold water, and it counts a great deal. It toughens the shoulder and removes all sweat and dirt. Galling will never occur if the horse is not overheated beneath the collar. It takes some thought and care to prevent this, especially on sultry, humid days.

Cultivation is very strenuous and heating, and upon sultry days the team should be rested often, the collar being lifted from the shoulders to allow them to dry and cool.




