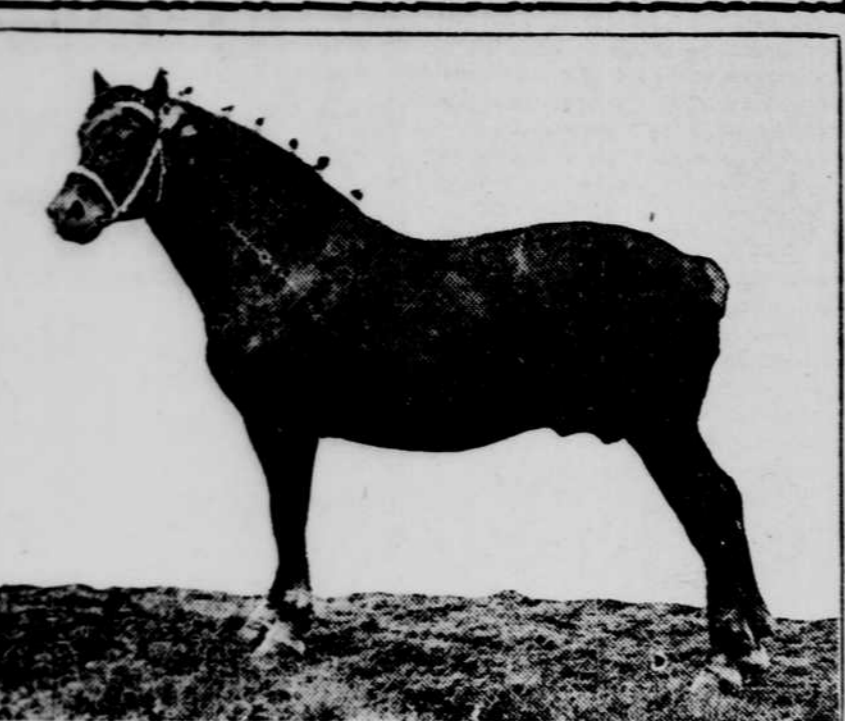

COLT REQUIRES BEST OF CARE ON FARM



Three-Year-Old Suffolk Stallion.

The young colt needs the best of care on the farm, for its life depends upon the care it gets during the first few weeks of its life. Navel-ill in colts requires close attention, for the disease is caused by a micro-organism. Several bacteria have been suspected of being responsible for this malady. Every one of the suspected organisms is found abundantly in manure and on objects contaminated with manure. The infective material gains entrance into the colt through the open umbilical cord, as a result of its coming in contact with litter, floors or discharge from its dam, contaminated by one of the organisms that cause the trouble.

One of the easiest ways to prevent the disease is to insist upon clean stables. It isn't a hard task to keep the stalls clean if they are watched each day. Mares in the latest stages of gestation should be placed in a box stall that has been previously cleaned and disinfected. The bedding should be renewed frequently and the external genital organs of the mare and the neighboring tissues should be cleaned and disinfected with a 2 per cent solution of carbolic acid, or a 1 per cent solution of some coal tar disinfectant. Operations for opening abscesses and the removal of afterbirths from cows should not be performed in the immediate vicinity of the pregnant mare. It is up to the farmer to watch these matters closely and a great many cases of navel-ill will be avoided.

MAKE HOPPERDOZER OUT OF SHEET IRON

Runners Are Riveted to Pan, Extending Both Backward and Forward as Illustrated.

The hopperdozer is constructed of sheet iron, preferably galvanized, of reasonable thickness to insure strength, and, except for the end pieces, made of a single sheet 10 or 12 feet long and 26 inches in width. The front is formed by turning up one edge a couple of inches, and the back may be turned up a foot, thus making a shallow pan 1 foot wide, with the back the same height and with a front 2 inches high. Ends are riveted in and soldered. Runners of old wagon tire are placed at each end, and another in the center is turned over in the front and back to strengthen the pan at these points. These runners are riveted to the pan, as shown, and should extend both backward and forward, in order to overcome to some extent the inequalities of the ground and cause the hopperdozer to run more smoothly.

USEFUL TOOLS FOR WORK IN ORCHARDS

Blade of Mowing Machine, Fitted to Wooden Handle, Will Be Found Satisfactory. A useful tool for cutting canes of ash fruits is made from the blade of a mowing machine fitted to a wooden handle. It looks like a tomahawk with a sharp blade on each side. The blade stands at an angle which gives it the right slope to cut well without tearing the plants. It should be made of the very best steel and the lower edge of the blade should be kept very sharp across the full face.

WHO IS WHO NOW

PAPAL SECRETARY OF STATE



Italy's participation in the European war necessarily involves to a certain extent the Holy See and the pope, and makes more important than usual the papal secretary of state, Cardinal Pietro Gasparri, who holds that high office, is a man of undoubted ability and long experience in church and diplomatic affairs.

After two years' hard work, having found it advisable to allow himself some relaxation, he took a vacation, traveling to the Holy Land in company with Monsignore, afterwards Cardinal Delai, and returned quietly to his work soon after. The purple cloth came to him one year later, with the consistory of December 16, 1907, not as the perfunctory conclusion of a bureaucratic career, but as an early and well-deserved recognition of very particular and brilliant merit.

BANKER-DOCTOR AT THE FRONT

Berkeley Sherwood-Dunn of New York has gone to Europe as the head of a French hospital unit on the firing line, and if anything should happen to this banker and doctor the United States would mourn the loss of a man who has been for years active in public movements. It is not surprising that he is giving his services to France, for in that country he was educated, first practiced medicine and became a leader in public welfare matters. Doctor Sherwood-Dunn was born in Rushford, N. Y., and after studying in the New York university took his degrees at the University of France, began practicing in Paris and was married there to an American girl. He was a member of a committee that revised the laws governing the admission of foreign students to the university, and prevented the threatened exclusion of Americans. Later he was one of the founders and directors of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals in Paris.



Some time after he returned to this country a group of bankers invited him to join with them in organizing the Century Trust company, and he became its secretary. As a result he became generally interested in the banking business, and in 1907-8 he was the president of the European-American bank. He sold his interest in it in 1908 and removed to South Carolina, where he was largely interested in the banking business and was president of several banks in that state. He is a director in several other banks and business corporations.

For some years she has been known as one of the most fearless and skilled of big game hunters, and her trips to Africa especially have resulted in extraordinary "bags" of elephants, lions and other large and fierce animals.

GIVE A NICKEL TO SUFFRAGE

Occupying a prominent place in the Washington headquarters of the Congressional Union for Woman Suffrage and pointed to as a "horrible example" is a nickel donated at a suffrage street meeting by Congressman Thomas Hefflin of Alabama, whom the women style the "arch enemy of suffrage in congress." An interesting story is told in connection with the Hefflin five-cent piece. One day Miss Elsie Hill, one of the leading speakers for "the cause," was conducting a meeting at a Pennsylvania avenue corner, and a large crowd had collected to listen to her eloquent pleas. Among her hearers were many who believed in the cause sufficiently to contribute liberally when she called for financial assistance for the organization. Just as they were handing over their cash along came Congressman Hefflin with some friends, and, seeing what was going on, the Alabama statesman flipped a nickel to one of the collectors, saying: "Take that for luck." The coin was mounted on a bit of cardboard, properly labeled and placed in the headquarters, where it takes rank with the anti-suffrage speech of former Congressman Bowditch of Ohio, also mounted and labeled.

VALUE OF THE "SCRAP HEAP"

Secondary Metals Have Added Much to the Wealth of the United States. In 1914 the value of the "secondary metals" exclusive of gold, silver, platinum, iron and steel, recovered in the United States was \$57,039,706, according to J. P. Dunlop of the United States geological survey. This is a decrease from 1913 of \$15,746,321, the secondary metals recovered in that year being valued at \$72,786,027. The term "secondary" does not imply that these metals, which are recovered from scrap metal, sweepings, skimmings, drosses, etc., are of inferior quality, but it is used to distinguish them from "primary metals," which are derived from ore. While the survey figures relative to lead, zinc, copper, aluminum, tin and antimony given in this statement cover a large field and form an essential addition to the reports on primary metals, the scope of the inquiry probably reveals less than one-half the extent of the waste-metal trade. The value of the old iron and steel re-used amounts to millions of dollars.
