Who does not remember having it impressed on him in his schooldays that the ministrations of the gulf stream alone made habitable the British Isles? It is not true, as patient study has shown. The southwest winds bring moisture from the ocean to Europe, and this great blanket of moist air contains much more latent heat than dry air at the same temperature. From the moist air come clouds, fogs and rain, which condense heat and water upon the Old World and prevent the loss of ground heat, by radiation. That is why there is such a striking difference in temperatures upon a single line of latitude cutting the two continents.






