

Minority Job Opportunities Survey Slated

Thirty-five members of the Central Social Action committee Monday night unanimously resolved to make a survey of job opportunities for racial and religious minority groups in Lincoln. The resolution was passed at a meeting at the Methodist Student House.

The survey is to determine whether prejudice is keeping members of the minority groups from getting jobs for which they are fitted. The executive committee was directed to work out plans for a survey.

The strategy committee suggested that the survey results could be used in supporting a state fair employment practices commission act.

Dr. Arthur L. Miller, president of the committee, reported that he could find no reason to believe that religious prejudice entered into the street fight on Sept. 17, in which Jack Solomon, Omaha student, suffered a fractured jaw.

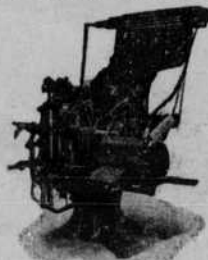
