Advocating a complete integrated democracy, Lawrence praised the new Trenton school system as "the best in the country." He told the youth that there must be "less accent on jitterbug and more on concrete, constructive action."

The large audience cheered him when he said that America is furthering the spread of communism as long as she adheres to the philosophies and theories of the ranting Rankins and Bilboes.
