A World of Books

Children who do not seem to care for books may often be attracted to some unusual or different book. There are novelty books for small children that would serve this purpose.

"Fraidy Cat" by Marjorie Burroughs is called a "Glowing-Eye Book." A little cat has eyes on a button head that glow in a darkened room. The pictures of the cat appear on every page, woven into a charming story of a little cat who overcame his many fears and was no longer a fraidy cat.

"How Tinkle Got Her Bell" by Harpoe is an odd-shaped book with a small bell attached to the inside of the back cover. As the story moves toward the happy ending, the bell appears with the turning of each page ringing merrily. On the very last page, Tinkle appears, the bell tied around her neck with a real red-ribbon bow.

"What Is It?" by Anna Pistorius is an unusual book, because it is really a game. On each page there are found small children asking questions about something in the illustrated background, that puzzles them. They always have to give up trying to answer their questions. Then someone suggests that they turn to a certain number on the dial on the back inside cover. The dial can be moved to the correct number and the correct answer is found.
