Scalloped Potatoes Supreme

- 8 potatoes or 2 quarts chopped
- 1/4 cup chopped green peppers
- 1/2 cup minced onion
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 1 can condensed Cream of Mushroom soup
- 1 cup milk

Alternate layers of potatoes, green pepper and onion in greased baking dish; season each layer with salt and pepper. Mix mushroom soup and milk, pour over potatoes. Cover and bake in moderate oven 1 1/2 hours. Serves 8 to 10.

Meat Loaf

- 1 1/2 lbs. ground meat
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1/2 can tomato soup
- 1 cup fresh bread crumbs
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Mix the above ingredients, form into loaf. Place in shallow pan

in moderate oven (350 degrees)

Meanwhile combine the following:

- 1/2 can tomato soup
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar or molasses
- 2 tablespoons prepared mustard
- 1 cup water
- 2 tablespoons vinegar

Pour over meat loaf; bake about 1 hour more, basting at least once. Serves 4 to 6.

"BB's" Own Salad

- 1 medium head of lettuce shredded
- 2 crisp carrots shredded
- 1 cup pineapple diced
- 1 cup Miracle Whip Salad Dressing
- 1 heaping tablespoon horseradish

Toss lettuce, carrots and pineapple together. Add the horseradish to the Miracle Whip dressing. Combine, put into refrigerator until well chilled. Serve in crisp lettuce cups.
