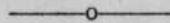
Howard Bean, son of Mrs. Maud Johnson, is spending some time home. He is in the U. S. Navy and entered service in 1946.

Merle Woodlee went to Denver Thursday, April 3rd.

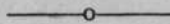
James Motley left Alliance April 3rd for the National A.A.U. Boxing tournament opening Monday, April 7 at Boston, Mass.
