Sunday School Lesson

Subject-"Religious reforms in Judah"

Lesson Text-2nd Kings 22-23

Memory Verse-"Give me understanding, and I shall keep Thy law".--Psalm 119:34

In our lesson today we find that Josiah started his reign at a very tender age, being only eight years old. It is almost certain that his rule, because of his youth was begun under a regent. That this regent was composed of godly men is certain.

Josiah, himself, sought, and found the Lord when he was sixteen.

After this he sent officers to gather money and direct the repairing of the house of the Lord. As the cleaning of God's house The Best Place to Trade after all Hilkiah, the high proceeded. priest, found the book of the law.

The very life of the nation depended upon God and His law and it seems amazing that His people should have permitted it to be lost.

With the reading of the law into Josiah's ears, he hastened to institute many reforms. Social, economic, and national life was improved. All idols were removed and the true worship of God was reinstated.

These same reforms are needed today in our national life. We

have neglected to read and study our Bible-the Law-so we have no real understanding of the will of God for our day and time. The theater the Sunday baseball game and the beer tavern all carry a larger crowd than does the church.

Too many of the devotees of these attractions are Christians. We need to read anew the law and make reforms.




