Carrot Loaf

1 1/2 cups carrots put through the food chopper
1 1/2 cups cracker crumbs
1 cup left-over meat, chopped or (1/2 cup ground nuts)
2 eggs
1 1/2 tsp. salt
1 1/2 cups strained tomatoes
1/4 tsp. pepper
1 Tbls. minced onion

Mix ingredients in order given. Put into a greased baking dish and cook covered 1 hour in moderate oven. Uncover and brown in hotter oven.

Perfect Soft Custard

4 cups of milk
1/4 tsp. salt
4 beaten eggs
1/2 cup sugar
1 tsp. vanilla

Scald milk and add remaining ingredients. Put in a greased baking dish in a pan containing small amount of water and bake in a slow (300 degree) oven for about 2 hours. Before baking I like to sprinkle the top with cinnamon or nutmeg. Must be cooked slowly to be nice. Knife will come out clean when cooked.

Don't throw away left over buttered vegetables! Rinse in cold water, marinate in a little French dressing, chill. They're delicious in both vegetable and fish salads and for hollowed-out tomato cups.

Summertime superlative. Mix cooked macaroni with tender cooked peas, shredded raw carrots, a touch of onion and salad dressing. Chopped celery and salami are grand in this too.
