**Quick Rolls**

Beat one egg and add 3/4 cup of milk that has been scalded and cooled. Crumble and add one cake of yeast and stir until it becomes smooth. Add 2 1/2 to 3 cups of good biscuit mix. Stir until a soft dough. Make into rolls & let rise until double in bulk. Bake in 375 degree oven for about 25 minutes. Can be kept in refrigerator and used as wanted.

**Parsnip Fritters**

2 Cups boiled parsnips (drain and mash)  
Add 2 tbs. melted butter  
1 tsp. salt.  
1 egg unbeaten  
Mix thoroughly and make into cakes about 1/2 inch thick and fry in deep fat until golden brown.

**Russian Tea**

1/2 cup sugar  
1/2 cup water  
1/8 teasp. powdered cloves  
1 2" stick cinnamon  
1 teasp. grated lemon rind  
1 teasp. grated orange rind  
1/4 cup orange juice  
2 tbs., lemon juice  
1/4 cup pineapple juice  
3 cups boiling water  
1/4 cup tea leaves  
Combine first six ingredients. Boil 10 minutes. Remove cinnamon; add juices; keep hot. Pour boiling water over tea. Steep 10 minutes. Strain. Combine mixtures. Serve in tea or punch cups. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

**Cheese Scrambled Eggs**

2 tbslp. fortified margarine  
6 eggs, beaten  
1/2 teasp. salt  
1/8 teasp. pepper  
1/2 cup milk  
1 1/2 3-oz. pkgs. cream cheese  
Melt margarine in double boiler. Tip it back and forth to cover sides. Combine eggs with salt, pepper, milk. Cook in double boiler, over boiling water, until eggs just begin to set on bottom and sides. Then occasionally scrape bottom and sides gently with spoon, so liquid portion flows to bottom. Repeat until eggs are nearly set. Fold in cheese cut in small pieces. Serve at once on toast. Makes 4 servings.
