Hearty Meat Loaf

Egg, 1 Tomato sauce, 8-ounce can Ground beef, 1 pound Onion, chopped fine, 1/4 cup Salt, 2 teaspoons Pepper, dash Prepared mustard 1 tablespoon Rolled oats, quick cooking, 1 cup Break egg into large bowl; beat slightly with fork. Add tomato sauce, beef, onion, salt, pepper, mustard; mix well stir in rolled oats. Pat into greased loaf pan (8 1/2 by 4 1/2 by 2 1/2 inches.) Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) about one hour. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

Savory Rice Casserole

Rice cooked, 2 cups Cheese, Process American, cubed, 1 cup Eggs, beaten, 2 Tomatoes, fresh or canned, -1 cup Salt, 1 tsp. Pepper, 1/4 tsp. Worcestershire sauce, 1/2 tsp.

Combine all ingredients and place in heatproof bowl or pan that will fit into your pressure pan. Tie waxed paper over bowl Place on rack with 2 cups water

in pan. Cook at 15 pounds pressure for 20 min.

Butter Horns

1/2 cup butter 1 1/2 tsp. salt Fleischman's yeast (2 cakes) 3 eggs 1/2 cup sugar 4 cups flour Scald milk, dissolve sugar and butter in milk — cool to luke warm. Sift flour and salt together. Dissolve yeast in 2 tbsp. of sugar and add to milk mixture. Beat eggs thoroughly and add to milk and yeast, last beat in flour. Let rise until light and bake in hot oven about 15 min.
