LOUISVILLE. (ANP). A group of Negroes just across the Ohio river at Jeffersonville, Ind., has ambitious plans to build a city. The plans call for 2,800 homes and business houses on lots which have in large part been purchased by colored people scattered over seven states.

The project is a cooperative association headed by Dr. Marshall Bell Lanier, the president of Simmons university, a small school here. The lots were sold by George Barker, a white man from Minneapolis who came to Louisville a year ago to sell the subdivision.

Streets have been lead, according to Barker, who says that work on construction of the first 22 homes will begin next week. The houses will be built by an all-Negro construction company headed by Henry Vaden of Bashville, Barket announced, saying that the
