Are You Satisfied With Your Church?

We have oeen hearing a lot about leadership as it regards organizations, homes and the churches in our communities in recent months and today a young woman, Mrs. Lenora Roberts, president of the B. T. U. of Mt. Zion Baptist Church brought in an article which she wished to have published for the benefit of her class work. I told her that I believed that the community at large should share the lesson. "What Will Make Our Church Strong?"

The speaker for the Thanksgiving service which was held at the church will be cemented together Streets made the statement in his introduction that he didn't know what would become of Lincoln's Negro civilizaion. Then she says, "if a church quarrels it has lost its usefulness in a community. Jesus Said, A new commandment I give unto you. That you love one another; By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples if ye love one another."

Then I especially liked the conclusion, "A strong church is made up of people who reproduce Christ in their daily lives, and they are concerned with the salvation of

She says that a church will grow stronger when it understands the value of time. By this she could mean many things. We often talk about the "good old days" but I wonder if we apply ourselves today as they did in those days.

In a survey of a large American city it was found that more than nine times as much attention was given to the life, customs, and citizenship of the ancient world than to the same topics in our own United States.

The welfare of any community is dependent upon its local leadership. Leaders are guided by the people they serve and the co-operation which they receive. More careful analyses and greater knowledge of the facts would temper these criticisms which are passed from door to door. We all should shoulder responsibilities in eliminating the stupidity and errors which records the failures in our churches and our com-
