Don't hang up the holly wreaths until you've washed the windows!

If the Christmas tree trunk is sawed off at a slant and set in cold water when it is taken in the house, the needles will stay green longer.

Brushing white paint on evergreen boughs will make them glisten and sparkle as if they were covered with frost or snow.

Small sprigs of pine, tied with red ribbon, on Christmas gift

packages make a pleasing addition to Christmas tree decorations.

Welcome Christmas gifts can be made by the children from bricks. Gaily painted, shellacked, and with a piece of felt glued to the bottom, a brick becomes a clever doorstep or bookend.

Liquid wax applied to berries and evergreen branches will keep them looking fresh during the Christmas season.

In gathering evergreen material for Christmas decorating, sharp cutting tools are absolutely essential. Be sure to cut all the material rather than breaking or pulling it.

Christmas tree decorations to be

made are not limited to popcorn and cranberry strings. Let the children try painting pine cones with silver or gilt.

Use candle clips on your Christmas tree without danger of fire by inserting a peppermint stick instead of a candle.

Writing with wrapping cord is fun, and will delight the person to whom you're giving the package. Wrap the gift, leaving ends of wrapping cord long. Brush them with resin glue (no odor) and when nearly dry, twist into shape.

Angel Salad.

2 tbsp. butter
4 egg yolks, beaten
1 tbsp. sugar
2 tbsp. vinegar
1/4 c. milk
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 lb. marshmallows,
cut in fourths

1 c. heavy cream, whipped
1/4 lb. walnuts, coarsely ground
No. 3 can crushed pineapple, drained
Green citron
Candied cherries

Melt butter in top of double boiler. Add combined egg yolks, sugar, vinegar, milk, and salt. Cook over gently boiling water until thickened, 2 min., stirring constantly. Add marshmallows. Stir and beat until marshmallows dissolve, about 6 min. Cool. Fold cooled egg and marshmallow mixture into whipped cream. Fold sauce into nuts and pineapple. Pour into 1 1/2 qt. molds. Chill. Unmold. Garnish with pieces of citron and candied cherries. Yield: 10 servings.
