### Sauces For Fish Dishes

A richly-colored and flavored sauce is just the thing to give fish more appeal in both looks and flavor.

**Horseradish Cream Sauce**  
1 cup thick sour cream, or 1 cup whipping cream, and 2 tablespoons lemon juice  
1/2 cup bottled horseradish  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/4 teaspoon pepper

Whip cream until stiff. Mix horseradish, salt and pepper, (and lemon juice if using sweet cream). Fold into whipped cream. Yield: 2 cups.

**Quick Tomato Sauce**  
1 can cream of tomato soup  
1 bay leaf  
4 cloves  
1 1/2 cup mayonnaise  
1/2 tablespoons finely chopped olives  
Heat tomato soup with bay leaf and cloves and simmer for

10 minutes. Strain. Combine mayonnaise and olives and fold into tomato mixture. Yield: 2 1/3 cups.

### Mornay Sauce

2 tablespoons butter  
2 tablespoons flour  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon prepared mustard  
Dash of cayenne  
1 cup milk  
1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce  
1/2 cup grated sharp cheese  
1 tablespoon lemon juice  
Melt butter in double boiler;
