Spicy Tomato Juice

To serve six large glasses of seasoned tomato juice, buy 1 1/2 quarts, canned or bottled, of the unseasoned variety. The labels will tell how much the containers hold.

Empty the juice into a jar or pitcher. Add:

- Juice of 1 lemon
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon celery salt or onion salt
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika

Pretzel Twigs

Cream 1/2 package cream cheese with salt, pepper and a drop of Tabasco sauce to taste. Take a spoonful of the cheese. Twirl the end of a pretzel in the cheese in the spoon. Roll the dipped portion in finely chopped pistachio nuts or toasted blanched almonds, also chopped fine. This much cheese will make 2 dozen twigs. Do these just before the folks arrive. They will soften if chilled. Your other appetizers can be ready and waiting on a tray in the refrigerator. But these shouldn't wait too long.

New Sewing Kink

When hemming a dress or skirt, hold the hem with bobby pins instead of basting. Fold the material and put the pins in at close intervals. They hold the hem without any damage to material.

Roasting Frankfurters

A wire corn popper is splendid for roasting frankfurters over a fireplace or outdoor fire.
