HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Butterscotch Coffee Cake

1 1/2 cups sifted enriched flour
2 teaspoons double-action baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup shortening
1/2 cup sugar
3 tablespoons unsulphured molasses
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 egg, unbeat
5/8 cup milk

Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Cream together shortening, sugar and molasses. Beat in egg and vanilla. Alternately add milk with sifted dry ingredients to the above mixture and beat 1/2 minute. Pour batter in a well-greased and lightly floured 9-inch square pan. Cover with crumbly topping. Bake 30 minutes in a moderately hot oven (375 degrees F.).

Crumbly Topping

1/4 cup sugar
1/2 cup flour
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 tablespoon unsulphured molasses
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
Combine sugar, flour and cin-

namon. With a fork, work in molasses and butter or margarine. Sprinkle crumbs over top of coffee cake before baking. Yield: Nine servings.

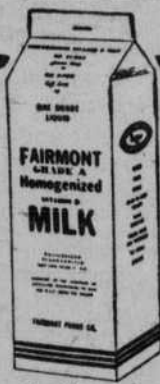
